



Chapel Favorites Tour

For the first time in history, the nuns' chapel and chancel are open to the public. The cultural mediation team is offering students a truly memorable experience in this place recognized as a Quebecois heritage treasure. Highlights of this must-see historical site include the decor sculpted in the 18th century and meticulously gilded with gold leaf by the Ursulines, Marie of the Incarnation's oratory and tomb, as well as 17th- and 18th-century paintings.

DURATION: 30-MINUTE TOUR

TOPICS COVERED

- Art

Students explore the paintings and gildings in the chapel, which are prominent works in Quebecois art history.

- Events

Students discover the site, which has witnessed landmark events in our history.

- Time

Students learn about the lifestyles of people who have spent time in this place (nuns, students, the public and historical figures such as Monseigneur de Laval and Lieutenant-General Montcalm, etc.).

THE TOUR

Students explore the themes presented during their interactive tour of the public and private sections of the nuns' chapel. Throughout the tour, they participate in the following activities related to the program topics:

- Matching game
- Observation game
- Role-playing game
- Interactive discussion

- Make critical and aesthetic judgments and justify one's point of view using information gathered and questions asked.

- Characterize different periods in the history of Quebec and Canada.
- Ascertain historical facts.
- Interpret a social reality.
