What was life like for boarding students at the Ursuline School in the 19th century?

During this visit, students are invited to discover and experience the life of boarding students from that time. Through role-playing games and votes, students will learn all about the day-to-day life of the boarders—following them from the dormitory to the refectory, stopping by for recreation and to receive points for their conduct.

Students will be asked to make comparisons between their daily life and that of boarding students from another era by answering questions about the subjects that were studied at the Ursuline School and by completing exercises on good manners.

This activity complements the learning progressions for science and technology as well as social studies programs.
